The attacks in Paris 2015 ended with 130 people dead and over 300 injured. The Brussel bombings in 2016 resulted in 35 deaths and over 200 wounded. Every country is susceptible to violent extremism and the threat of terroristic attacks has no jurisdiction. Under the pressure of these recent attacks it has become clear that cohesions amongst policy makers and practitioners is essential to managing security risks, preventing the emergence of terrorism and protecting the public.

Terrorism is a consequence of Extreme radicalisation, a process that develops overtime. A process which if identified early on can safeguard vulnerable people from the messages of terrorism. The responsibility to prevent these efforts rests within many sectors of society; this includes law enforcement.

Our multi-agency project, titled Pericles, represents a selection of international organisation, whose combined efforts and expertise aim to provide the following:

- Highlight major gaps in current counter-radicalisation efforts and designs the latest tools to address this void.
- Hands on research with families of extremists to deepen the understanding of radicalisation
- Formalise the cooperation between communities, law enforcement agencies and policy makers to reduce violence and victimisation
- The development of tools tailored to the needs of practitioners

OUR STRATEGY

Pericles will deliver the following European tools which will better enable public authorities and public actors across the world to fight against radicalisation:

- STATE OF THE ART early warning system which utilises the Dark Web to identify dangerous content which would mislead vulnerable individuals.
- ENHANCE NEEDS ASSESSMENT of public authorities and families of radicalised individuals will generate fresh insight into which tools are need to counter against radicalisation
- UPGRADING the awareness training of law enforcement agencies from our latest knowledge of the radicalisation indicators and custom technology
